NSPCC Fundraising 'thank you'


Our NSPCC Number Day on Friday 7th February was a really good way to complete our Maths focus week. The non-uniform day once again was very well supported and we raised £180 which has been split between the NSPCC and funds for equipment needed by our newly qualified team of Year 5 Peer Mentors.

'Mission to Mars' STEM workshops

The children gave very positive feedback about the Y4/Y5 STEM workshops. Liz Ferguson who led both the class based and family workshops was again delighted with the response from Eastlea parents/carers who attended these events in such large numbers. I know that several families have 'signed up' for further STEM activities with Liz at Woodhorn Museum. Thank you for your support.

Reading Challenge and World Book Day

- Last week we presented the first of the silver awards for the whole school 'Castles Reading Challenge'. 118 children now have their next certificate and a 'crown' badge. Well done! If your child reads over the half term break and has their reading record signed then this will count as a sticker on their current bookmark...bronze, silver or gold! So, please encourage them to keep reading!
- On the Thursday of the first week back after the half term break it will be World Book Day which this year Eastlea is celebrating on THURSDAY 6TH MARCH. We have a choice of options for this national dress up day. Children can either come to school in their pyjamas/dressing gowns and/or onesies OR they can come in a book character/themed outfit. Whichever they choose, please also encourage them to bring in their favourite book for some reading themed activities in school. A reminder and further details will be sent out after the holiday.



Residential visits for Year 5/Year 6

We have again been informed by the county that vouchers will be available over the February half term holiday for those families eligible for benefit based free school meals. An email notification will be sent out this week so that you can activate and use the vouchers over the holiday period.

Hope Centre reminder

At this half way point in the school year, there may be some items of uniform that need 'refreshing'.

A reminder that, for anyone who needs it, clean, good quality school uniform such as sweatshirts/cardigans, trousers, skirts, pinafores, shoes, PE kit, coats etc for all the local schools (including Eastlea and CLV) can be obtained **FREE OF CHARGE** from the Hope Centre in Cramlington. There is no need for a referral – just turn up on Monday to Friday 10am – 2pm to see what is available. Any pre-loved, good quality items of school uniform can also be donated to the Hope Centre. Items can be taken there directly or we can have them collected from school.



Garden repairs and funds to replace the damaged poly-tunnel – THANK YOU!

It was in February <u>last</u> year that we were explaining about the loss of our polytunnel in the early spring gales. Unfortunately, despite a new poly tunnel being purchased with the structure concreted in for what we thought was protection, Eastlea was again the victim of the bad weather in late January caused by storm Éowyn. Miss Fox has decided not to have another poly tunnel but instead replace it with some different structures and equipment which will mean that we can keep on gardening but do so hopefully without risk of storm damage. The garden area will be redesigned and we hope to make good use of it again as part of the 'Roots and Shoots' project at Alnwick Garden which Year 5 have been lucky enough to be selected to get involved with again this academic year.

We have received two 'gardening' donations so far totalling £400 – from the Rotary Club of Cramlington and also from a family of the school for which we are really grateful. Other funding streams are also been looked into by school Governors and we will inform you of further plans when we know more details.



Looking ahead to the next half term – advance notice of dates for the diary
