The spring term comes to an end this week and as always the 'run in' to the Easter holidays has been a busy time for the children in school. ### **Residential visits**

Last week, saw the majority of the **Year 5** class involved in the 3-day **residential visit to Robinwood**. This is the first time we have used this centre (near Alston) and it certainly provided a high-quality visit with an action-packed programme of activities. The 3 staff who volunteered to accompany the children came back full of praise for the attitude, behaviour and enthusiasm shown by the children who were apparently regularly commended for their behaviour by all the Robinwood staff. This is fantastic news and something we do not take for granted. We are very proud of them all!

#### **Brainwaves and Peer Mentors**

Our older children in Year 5 / Year 6 always take their roles and responsibilities seriously, but this half term I have been particularly impressed with:

- The way the Year 5 Peer Mentors have adapted to their new role by supporting younger children in school – using time before school and at breaks / lunchtimes to help out those who may be struggling a little bit with various aspects of school life. There have been some real success stories with how well this is working. Well done Year 5!
- The enthusiasm shown by the Brainwaves team in collating pupil views about breaks/lunchtimes, deciding on ideas for improvements and sourcing new equipment. They have put into place a revised programme of playground zones and organised different activities throughout the week including hooping/skipping, building blocks/stepping stones, circus skills (juggling, plate spinning), using the bum boards, arranging colouring activities, use of chalks, providing footballs for each class etc. Our lunchtimes have run far more smoothly as a result. # **Dinner money and Breakfast Club payments**

If anyone has any money that still needs to be paid for school dinners and / or breakfast club the office staff have asked me to remind you that these must be paid by Friday morning at the very latest as we need to be able to balance the books for the end of term. ### FSM vouchers for groceries and 'Holiday Activities'

- The HUGGG vouchers (groceries) will again be available over the Easter holiday for those families eligible for benefit based free school meals. Please look out for the email notification so that you can activate and use the vouchers over the holiday period. Remember these vouchers have an expiry date of 30<sup>th</sup> April and NCC have asked us to reinforce the following message:
  - Please ensure this voucher is used for its intended purpose only. The voucher must not be sold, passed on or used for any other purpose. If you are not able to use it, or do not require the vouchers for food/clothing please contact the school and arrange for its return. Northumberland County Council reserve the right to carry out checks to ensure the vouchers are used for their intended purpose, and by accepting this voucher you agree to these checks being undertaken. If anyone is found to mis-use the voucher Northumberland County Council may take action to recover the money, in full, from you as well as taking any other action they deem appropriate.
- 'Holiday Activity and Food' programme (HAF) vouchers have also been made available for the first time and went live on 25<sup>th</sup> March. The vouchers can be activated via the email or text sent to families directly and this will allow you to see the list of possible options which you may wish to sign up for over Easter. I know that several families have already done this and found several useful activities for their children to take part in. Please note that not all activities are suitable for every year group and that Places for the different activities are allocated on a first come, first served basis.

# **Holiday reminders**

- Parents of Nursery pupils will hear on 16<sup>th</sup> April about the allocation of places for Reception 2025. As has been the case in recent years we look set to be over-subscribed which may mean that a small number of families who have children attending our Eastlea Nursery will not secure a place for their child in our Reception class for September 2025. Unfortunately it is something that is totally out of our hands. We are bound by what is called 'infant class size legislation' which means we are legally not allowed to go over our school admission number of 30 in Reception. For families who do not get their first choice of schools it is always a difficult time and it will be made harder this year as Eastlea staff will not be on hand to offer advice and support on the morning of allocation day. If there are any questions or concerns we will be more than happy to discuss these as soon as we return after Easter.
- Our Castles Reading Challenge doesn't stop over Easter. If your child reads and has their reading
  record signed once at any time over the Easter break then this counts as a sticker on their bookmark...it
  is 'Gold 10' on our weekly schedule. The first GOLD awards will be presented at the end of the first
  week back after the holiday.
- A reminder for Year 3 that they are taking part in a 'Toon Team Day' on the first day back (Monday 28<sup>th</sup> April) with a visit to St James' Park as part of our work with the Newcastle United Foundation. The letter and information shared by Mrs Powells contained all the details.

#### **Happy Easter and Golden Day**
